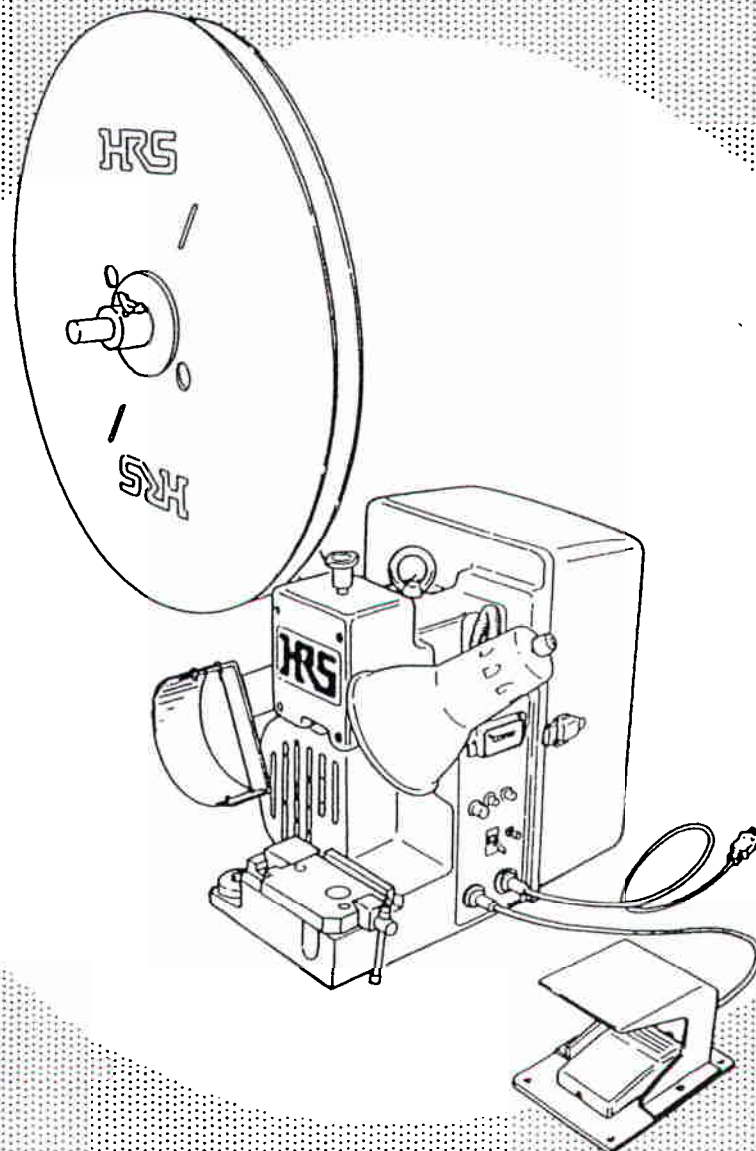

# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When operating this machine there is always the possibility of contact with the moving parts. The machine operator and maintenance personnel are required to read the following **SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS** so as to handle the machine taking care not to get hurt. To fully understand the description given in this Instruction Manual and the warning labels attached on the machine, the warning messages are used in accordance with the below-stated classification. Please be sure to thoroughly understand the messages and follow the instructions.




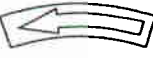

## (I) Description of warning messages

 <b>DANGER</b>	Used in the case where it is assumed that misuse of the machine will expose the operator to immediate danger of major injury or death.
 <b>WARNING</b>	Used in the case where it is assumed that misuse of the machine can expose the operator to danger of major injury or death.
 <b>CAUTION</b>	Used in the case where it is assumed that misuse of the machine can expose the operator to danger of injury and can cause damage to property.

\* Determine the degree of impairment referring to the below-stated classification.

- Major injury: Indicates the loss of eyesight, wounds, burns (hyperthermal burns and hypothermal burns), electric shocks, fracture of a bone, poisoning, etc. attended with aftereffect, requiring hospital treatment or attending-to-hospital treatment for an extended period of time.
- Injury (Minor injury): Indicates wounds, burns, electric shocks, etc. requiring neither hospital treatment nor attending-to-hospital treatment for an extended period of time.
- Damage to property: Indicates damage spread to premises, household goods, livestock and pets.

# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



## DANGER

1. To protect against shock hazards when opening the cover, first turn the power off. Then, wait for a minimum of five minutes before opening the cover.

\* For the purpose of this manual, an accident is an event that causes personal injury or damage to property.



## CAUTION

### Basic safety instructions

1. Be sure to read this Instruction Manual and any other instructions or materials supplied with the unit as accessories. Keep this Instruction Manual carefully and make it available for reference.

### Safety device and warning labels

1. To avoid possible accidents due to lack of the safety device, be sure to operate the machine after ascertaining that the safety device is properly installed at the predetermined position. Refer to page iv for detailed description of the safety device.
2. If the safety device is detached from the machine for any reason, replace it to its original position and check to be sure that it normally functions.
3. Be sure to maintain the warning labels on the machine. They should be clear and visible at all times. If any of the warning labels should come off or become soiled/damaged, replace it with a new one.

### Application

1. This machine shall only be used as specified in this Instruction Manual.
2. Modifications to this machine is prohibited. We assume no responsibility for accidents resulting from modifications.

### Operating environment

1. To avoid accidents caused by malfunction, the machine shall be operated under an environment that is not affected by high noise sources (electromagnetic waves) such as high-frequency welders.
2. To avoid accidents caused by malfunction, the machine shall not be used in such an environment that would subject it to any voltage rating outside of "rated voltage  $\pm 10\%$ ".
3. The machine shall be used under the following environment for safety.

Atmospheric temperature under operating conditions	5°C to 35°C
Relative humidity under operating conditions	35% to 85 %
4. Condensation can be observed when the environment of the machine is changed abruptly from cold to warm. To avoid accidents or damage, do not operate this machine in condition where the humidity is greater than the upper limit of the relative humidity specified above.
5. To avoid accidents caused by a damaged electrical part function, in the event of thunder and lightning, stop your work and pull out the power plug.

### Training

1. To prevent possible accidents caused by unfamiliarity with the operation of the machine, the machine should only be operated by fully trained personnel.

It is recommended that a training procedure be established by the employer and that the operator be provided with this Instruction Manual for reference.

### Working wear

1. To protect against possible accidents resulting in personal injury or damage to personal property (i.e., clothing), be sure wear a work uniform or fit clothing with sleeve cuffs fastened.
2. The operator should secure their hair with a hat or ponytail to protect his/her hair from being caught in the machine.
3. The operator should wear safe, rubber bottom, close toe shoes or work boots.

### Event that requires turn-off of the power

1. In the event of abnormal conditions, machine failure or power failure, the power should be turned off immediately.
2. To protect against possible accidents caused by abrupt start of the machine, the power must be turned off before conducting inspection, repair, or cleaning. Be sure to turn the power off when the operator leaves the machine.
3. To pull out the power plug, hold the plug rather than the cord.

\* "Turn-off the power" means turning off the power switch and pulling the power plug out of the receptacle. (This applies to any case where the "turn-off the power" is hereinafter referred to.)

## Safety instructions in each category of work following the delivery of the machine

### Transportation

1. To protect against possible accident or damage, the machine should be lifted by two or more persons. Use an eye bolt attached on the machine and an apparatus, such as chain block, specifically designed to lift heavy cargo. To move the machine, a dolly is recommended.
2. The machine shall be lifted or moved in such a way that secures safety to avoid falling and dropping.
3. To protect against accidents or damage to the machine re-package, if necessary, to achieve the originally-delivered state. Prior to re-packaging, wipe off an oil gathered on the machine.

### Unpacking

1. To protect against personal injury, carefully check the box for wood nails. Draw out nails from the boards.
2. The center of gravity of the machine is at the center of the eye bolt mounting section. Remove the machine out of the container carefully.

### Installation

#### (I) Work bench

1. Use a table or a work bench that will sufficiently withstand the machine weight and the reaction force developed while the machine is in operation.
2. If casters are to be mounted on the main unit of the work bench, use durable casters provided with a locking mechanism.

#### (II) Cable and wiring

1. To prevent electric shocks, electrical leak or fire, be careful not to strain the cables at any time.
2. To protect against hazards from electric shocks, electrical leak and fire, multiple connection must be avoided. Plug the machine direct into a socket.
3. Connectors should be secured together. Pull out a connector, hold at the connector portion.

#### (III) Grounding

1. An Electrical Expert should be consulted to properly install an appropriate plug.
2. The connect the power plug to a properly grounded receptacle.
3. This will protect against hazards from electrical leak and isolation withstanding pressure.

### Before operation

1. To protect against possible accidents resulting in injury or death, check to be sure that connectors and cables are in good condition and fastened securely.
2. To protect against possible accidents resulting in injury or death, never place hands in or near moving parts of the machine.

### Lubrication



1. Use oil of the type designated by Hirose.
2. In the event that oil should gets in your eye or contact your skin, immediately wash skin or flush eyes to remove the oil. This will protect against irritations and rashes.
3. In the event that you should ingest oil by mistake, immediately consult a medical doctor to prevent illness.

### Maintenance

1. To prevent possible accidents, repair and adjustment of the machine shall be conducted only by maintenance personnel who have been trained on the machine. Any repair and adjustment not specified in this Instruction Manual are prohibited. We assume no responsibility for accidents caused by improper repair or adjustment including the use of non-genuine part(s).
2. To protect against possible accidents and electric shock hazards, repair and maintenance work (including wiring) of electrical parts should be conducted by electrical technicians or Hirose engineers. In the event that electrical parts need repair and maintenance, please consult any of the aforementioned persons.
3. To protect against personal injury, check to be sure that screws and nuts are tightened after the completion of repair/adjusting and/or replacement of parts.
4. Periodically clean the machine as long as it is commissioned. To prevent possible accidents caused by an abrupt start of the machine during cleaning, be sure to turn the power off including unplugging it, before beginning cleaning.
5. In the event that your machine fails to perform normally after repair/adjusting works, immediately stop operation. Contact Hirose for service to protect against personal injury.

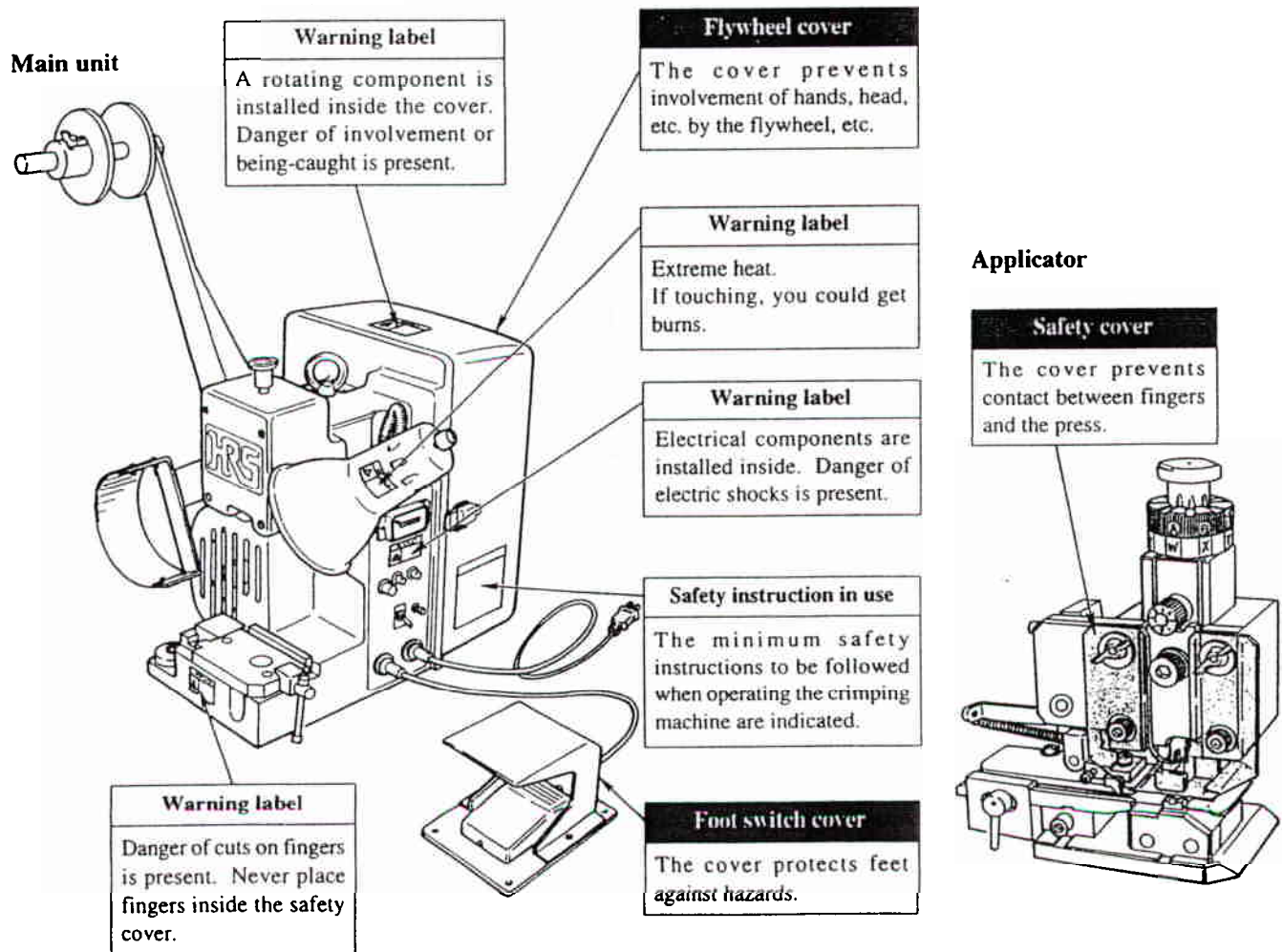

Also, do not place any matter that is not necessary in the use of the machine near any of the moving parts.</li> <li>2. To protect against possible personal injury, when turning the power on, take care to keep your hands, fingers, clothing, head or hair away from the moving parts and the surrounding area. Also, do not place any matter that is not necessary in the use of the machine near any of the moving parts.</li> <li>3. To protect against electric shock and accidents caused by any damaged electrical component, be sure to turn off the power switch before connecting or detaching the power plug.</li> <li>4. In the case where the machine is suddenly moved from a cold to warm weather conditions condensation can result. 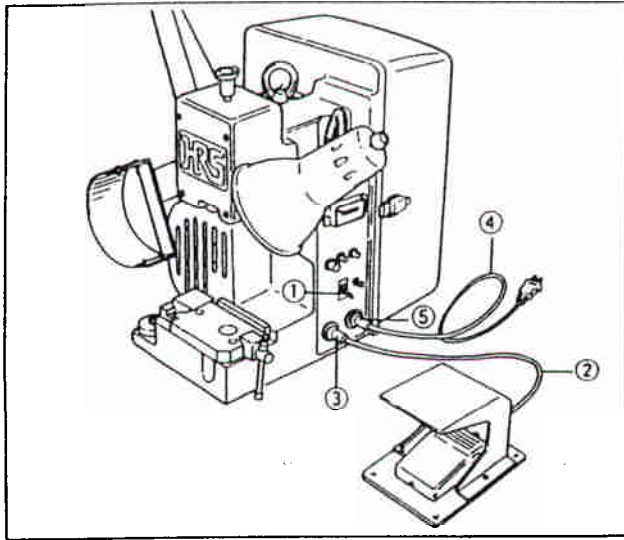
1) Place a rubber mat on the work bench that is stable and leveled. Place the machine on the rubber mat.



2) Fit the bolts in two mounting holes and tighten them.



## 5. OPERATION



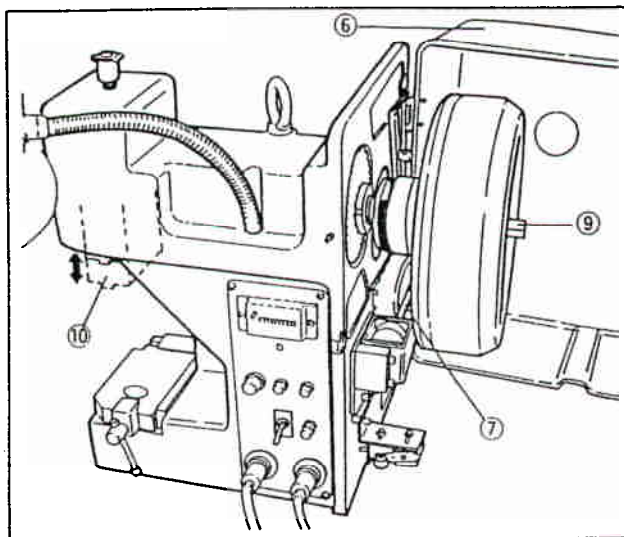
### (1) Preparation



#### CAUTION :

To protect against shock hazards and possible accidents due to abrupt start of the machine, do not power on the machine until you have completed the preparation.

- 1) Check to be sure that the applicator has been detached.
- 2) Make sure that main power switch ① mounted on the right-hand side is in the OFF position.
- 3) Connect foot switch cord ② to metal receptacle ③ (3P).
- 4) Connect power cord ④ to metal receptacle ⑤ (2P).



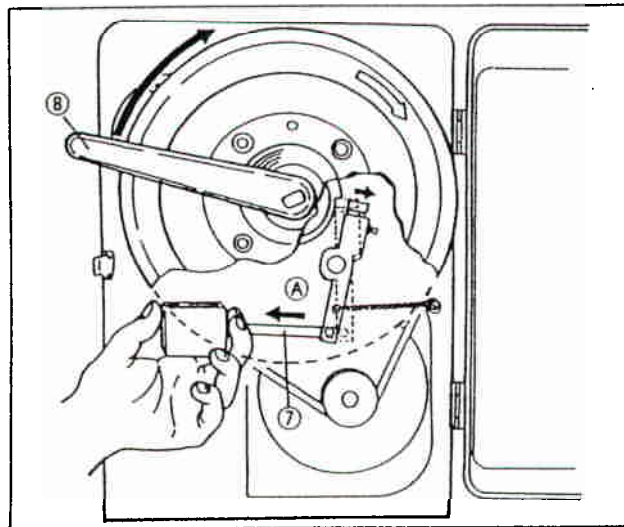
### (2) Checking the performance before putting the machine into service

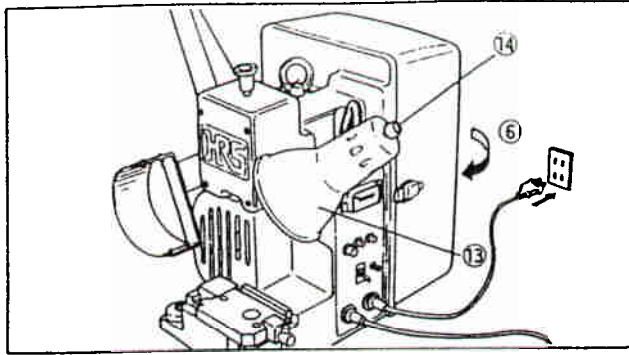


#### WARNING :

Extreme caution has to be taken not to allow hands, fingers, head and clothing to be involved/ caught in the moving parts of the machine.

- 1) Open flywheel cover ⑥ .
- 2) Press solenoid link ⑦ in the direction of arrow ① to engage the clutch.
- 3) Attach hand-turning handle ⑧ to main shaft ⑨ .
- 4) Turn hand-turning handle ⑧ in the direction of rotation. Simultaneously with the turning of the handle, ram unit ⑩ vertically moves.
- 5) After the vertical motion of ram unit ⑩ is checked, further turn hand-turning handle ⑧ in the direction of rotation until it stops with a "click." This disengages the clutch.
- 6) Remove hand-turning handle ⑧ from main shaft ⑨ .
- 7) After the vertical motion of ram unit ⑩ is checked, close flywheel cover ⑥ . (If flywheel cover ⑥ is opened, the safety switch functions to prevent the motor from starting even if the power switch is set to the ON.)





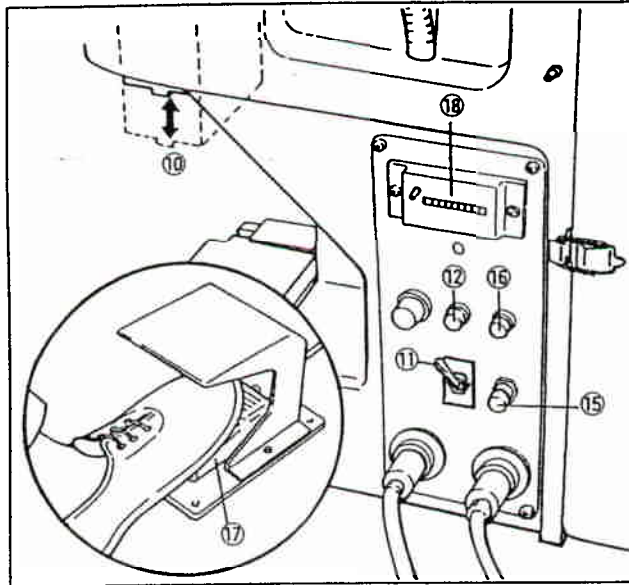
### (3) Checking the operation



#### WARNING :

Extreme caution has to be taken not to allow hands, fingers, head and clothing to be involved/ caught in the moving parts of the machine.

- 1) Connect the plug of power cord ④ to the power supply receptacle.
- 2) Set main power switch ⑪ to the ON position. Power pilot lamp ⑫ lights up. At this time, work light ⑬ lights up and goes out corresponding to ON/OFF of work light switch ⑭.
- 3) Press motor start switch ⑮. This will cause the motor to start. At the same time, motor pilot lamp ⑯ lights up.
- 4) Depress the switch mounted in foot switch ⑰. This will cause ram unit ⑩ to make a vertical travel once. At the same time, counter ⑱ actuates.
- 5) Set main power switch ⑪ to the OFF position, and both power pilot lamp ⑫ and motor pilot lamp ⑯ will go out.

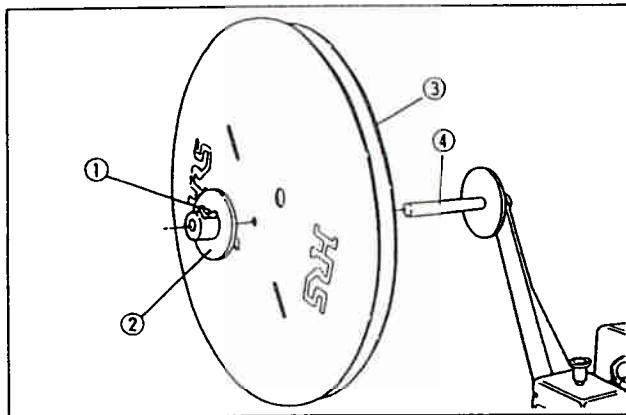


## 6. ATTACHING/DETACHING THE REEL TERMINAL



#### CAUTION :

To protect against possible accidents due to abrupt start of the machine, power down the machine before you begin this procedure.



### (1) Attaching the reel terminal

- 1) Loosen thumb-screw ①, remove flange ②, and pass reel terminal ③ over reel shaft ④.
- 2) Re-place flange ②, lightly press it and re-tighten thumb-screw ① to the correct position.

(Caution) Refer to the instruction manual for your applicable applicator for details.

### (2) Detaching the reel terminal

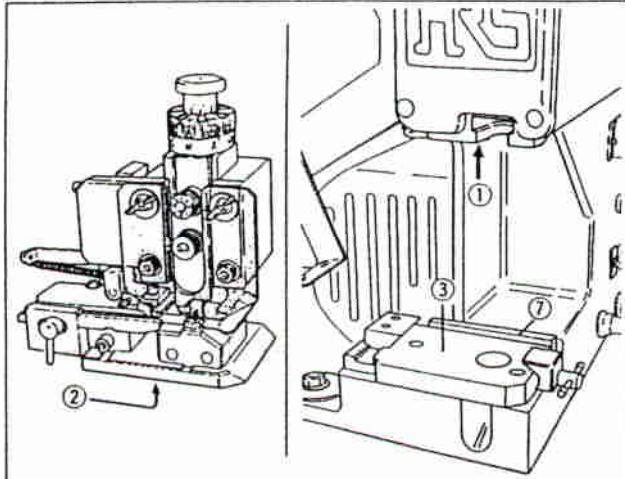
- 1) Detach the reel terminal following the same procedure as that taken to attach it.

## 7. ATTACHING/DETACHING THE APPLICATOR



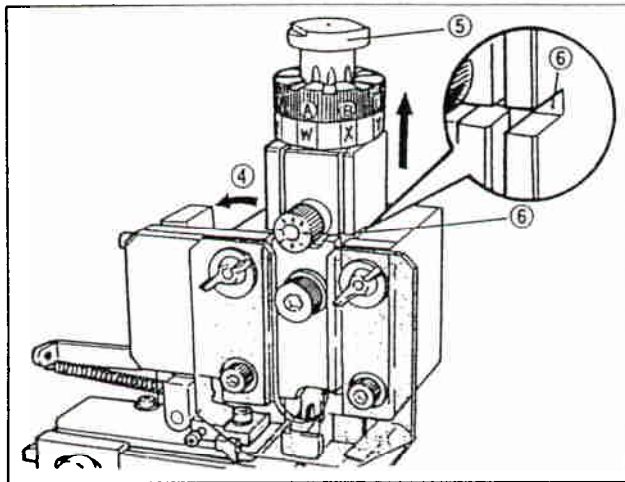
### CAUTION :

To protect against possible accidents due to abrupt start of the machine, power down the machine before starting this procedure.

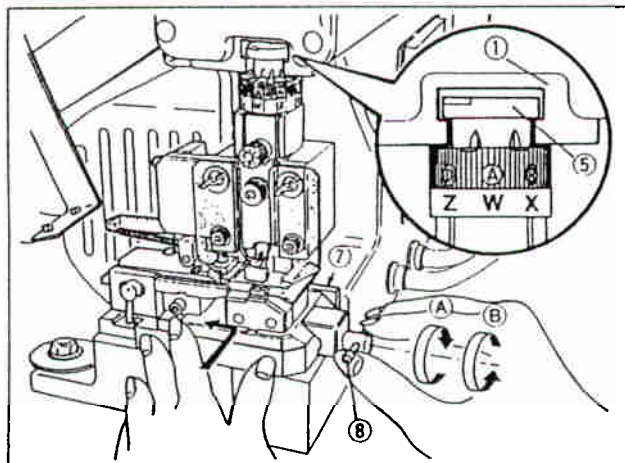


### (1) Attaching the applicator

- 1) Turn the power off.
- 2) To attach the applicator, be sure to check the performance before putting the machine into service (refer to "5-(2) Checking the performance before putting the machine into service") to ascertain that the ram is in its top dead center (1).
- 3) Thoroughly remove dust and stains from bottom face (2) of the applicator base and top face (contact plane) (3) of the bolster plate.



- 4) Keeping terminal feed lever (4) held tilted in the direction of the arrow, lift shank (5) (do not draw it out) to fit it in slit (6) on the main unit.



- 5) Place the applicator on the top face of bolster plate (3) and slide it forward until it is pressed against stopper block (7).
- 6) Press clamp lever (8) in the direction of arrow (A) until it is secured.  
At this time, make sure that shank (5) is attaching on ram (1).

(Caution) This completes the installation of the applicator. Never carry out a crimp, in this state, with no material loaded.

### (2) Detaching the applicator

- 1) Loosen clamp lever (8) by turning it in the direction of arrow (B) and pull the applicator until it comes off.

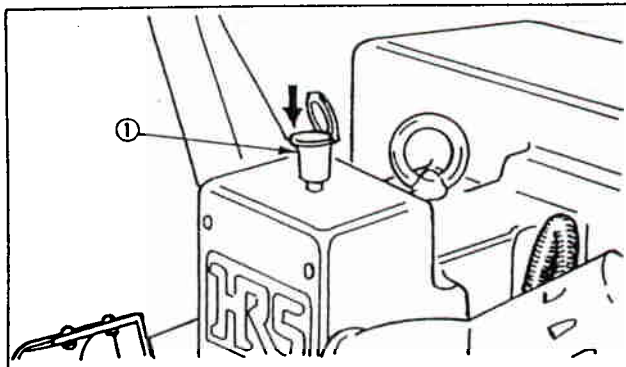

To protect against possible accidents and electric shock hazards, repair and maintenance work (including wiring) of electrical parts should be conducted by electrical technicians or HIROSE engineers. In the event that electrical parts need repair or maintenance, please consult any of the aforementioned persons.

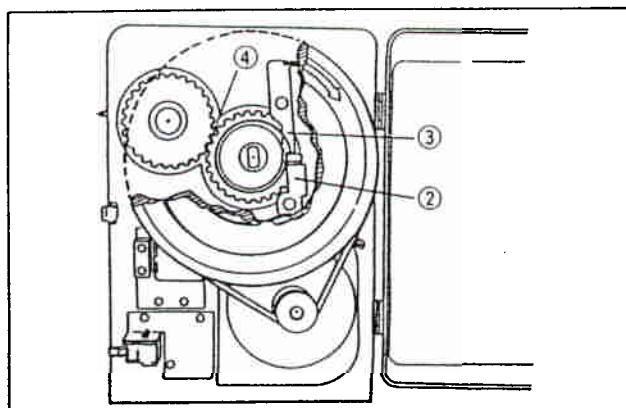


### (1)-1. Sliding section of the ram

- 1) Once a week, apply four or five drops of oil in oil cup ① on the top of the machine.

Designated oil = ISO VG32

(Caution) Avoid excessive oiling.



### (1)-2. Sliding section of the clutch unit

- 1) Once a month, apply grease lightly on clutch claw ②, back-stop claw ③ and surrounding area.
- 2) Once every six month, apply 2 to 3 cc of grease to helical gear ④.

Designated grease = Grease for centralized lubrication NLGI 2

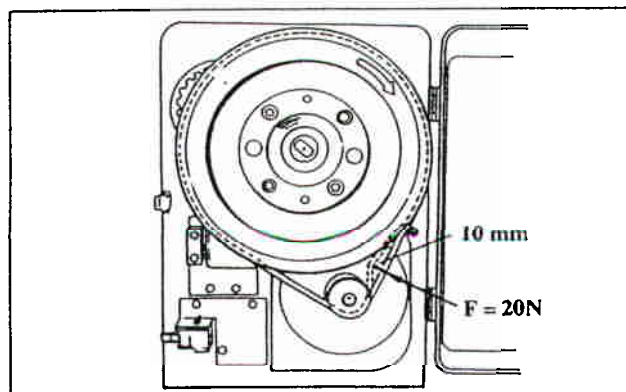
(Caution) Avoid excessive greasing.

## (2) Inspection

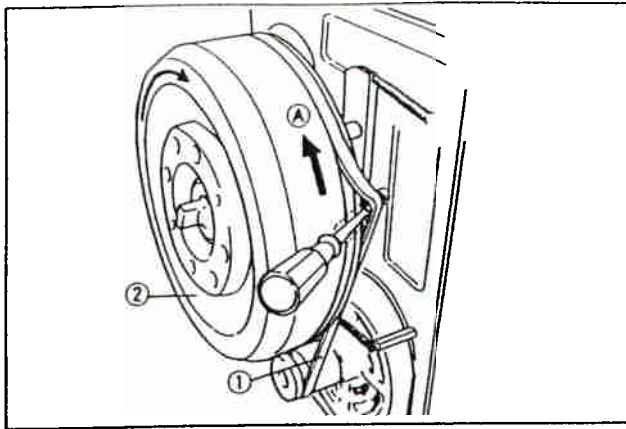
1. Extreme caution has to be taken not to allow hands, fingers, head, hair or clothing to be caught in the moving parts of the machine and V-belt.
2. To protect against possible accidents due to abrupt start of the machine, power down the machine before starting this procedure.



### (2)-1. Checking the V-belt for damage and slack

- 1) Check to be sure that the V-belt has no abnormal scratches and stains.
- 2) With respect to the degree of slack, make sure that the V-belt sags approximately 10 mm in the direction of the arrow when a 20 N load is applied.

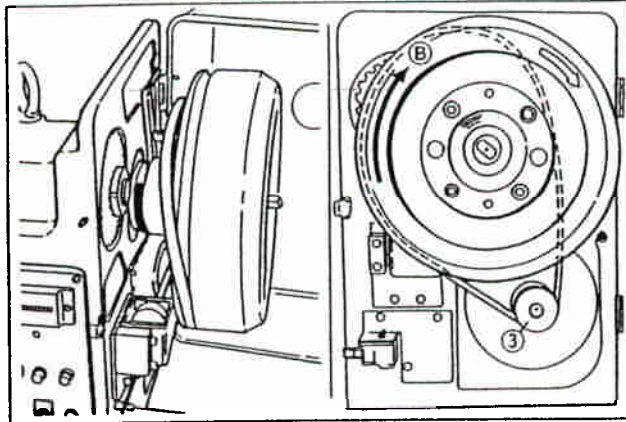




## (2)-2. Replacing the V-belt

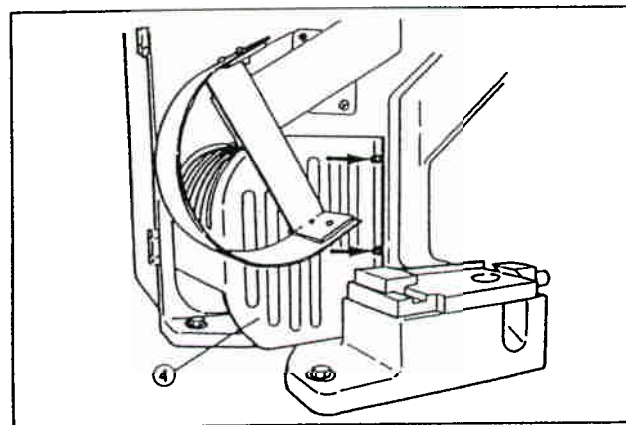
### \* Detaching the V-belt

- 1) Hold V-belt ① with a screwdriver to allow V-belt to come off the slit on flywheel ②.
- 2) Now, carefully turn flywheel ② in the direction of arrow ④ until the V-belt comes off.



### \* Attaching the V-belt

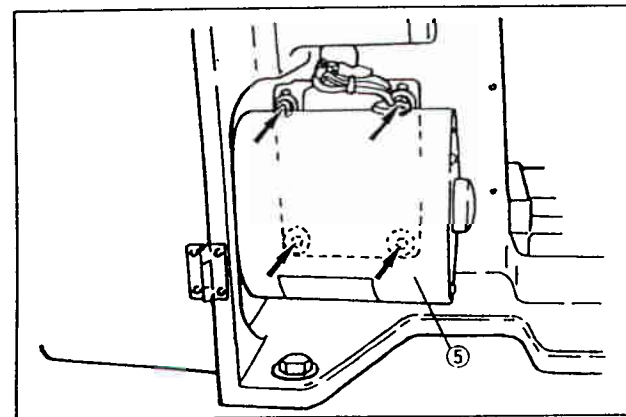
- 1) Pass V-belt ① inside flywheel ②.
- 2) Fit the V-belt in the slit on motor pulley ③.
- 3) Then, pressing V-belt ① against the slit on flywheel ②, carefully turn flywheel ② in the direction of arrow ④ until the V-belt fits in the slot.



## (2)-3. How to adjust the slack of the V-belt

Adjust the slack of V-belt ① by changing the installing position of motor ⑤ up or down.



- 1) Remove two mounting screws (M4) from motor cover ④.
- 2) Loosen four bolts (M5) used to mount motor ⑤ to such an extent that allows the motor ⑤ to move. (If these bolts are excessively loosened in this step, motor ⑤ will drop by gravity. Make a cushion with a shop cloth and place it in the space provided by lifting motor ⑤ to avoid hands and fingers being caught in the space.)
- 3) While in this position, move the mounting position of motor ⑤ up or down while checking the extent of slack of V-belt ①.
- 4) Tighten four bolts (M5) to fit the motor to a position that allows the V-belt to slack appropriately. (Re-check the slack of V-belt ①. Tightening the bolts can change the slack of the V-belt.)
- 5) Finally, attach motor cover ④ in position.



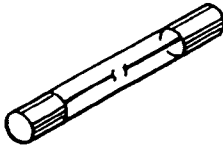
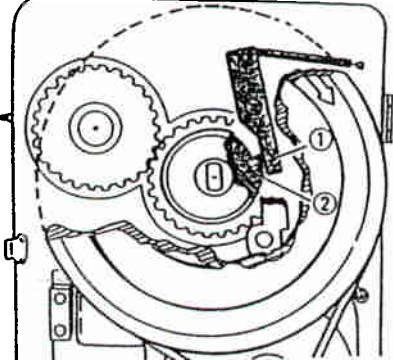
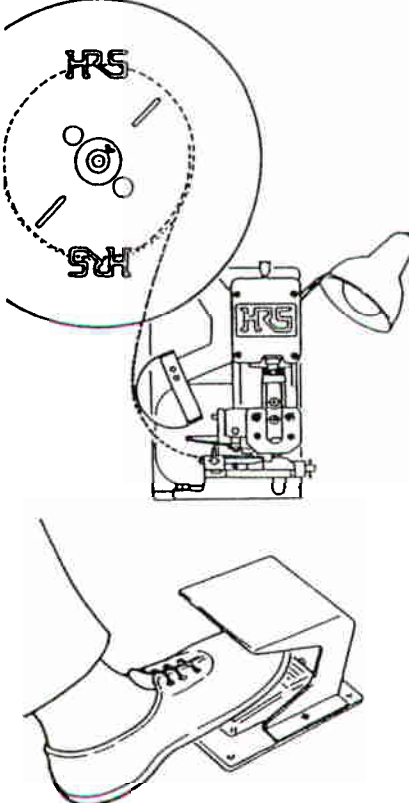
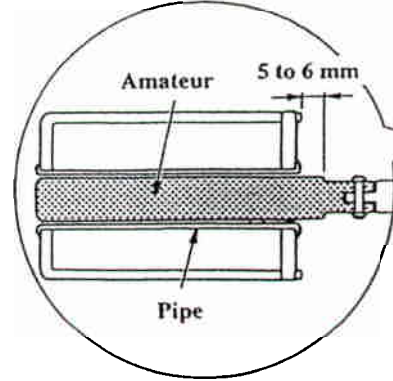
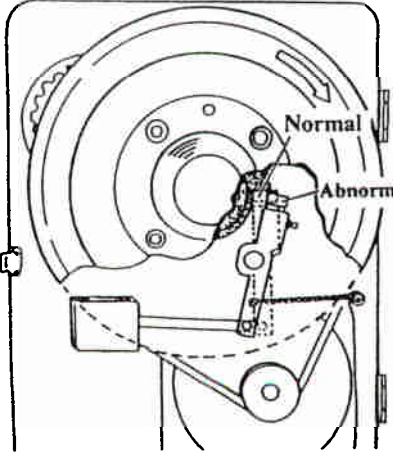
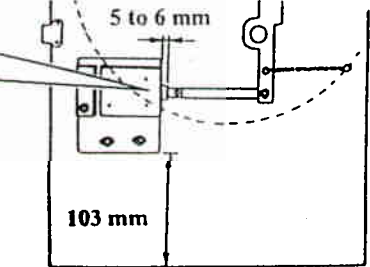
# 9. TROUBLESHOOTING

Before troubleshooting, the following has to be checked.

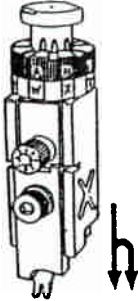

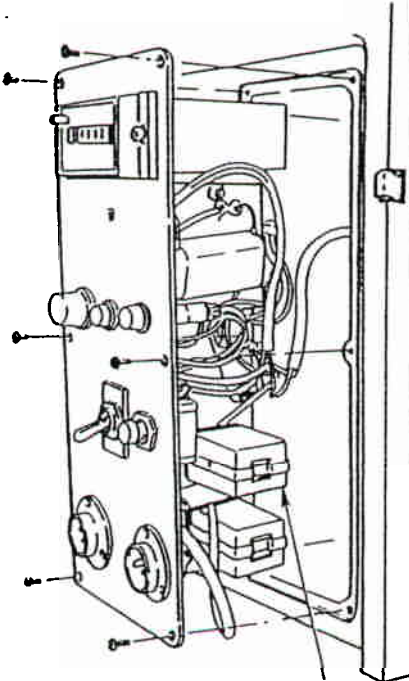

- 1) Is the power plug connected to a 100 V power supply receptacle?
- 2) Has the fuse blown?
- 3) Are connectors fitted properly? (Power cord, foot switch cord, inside the electrical box)
- 4) Is the flywheel cover correctly closed?

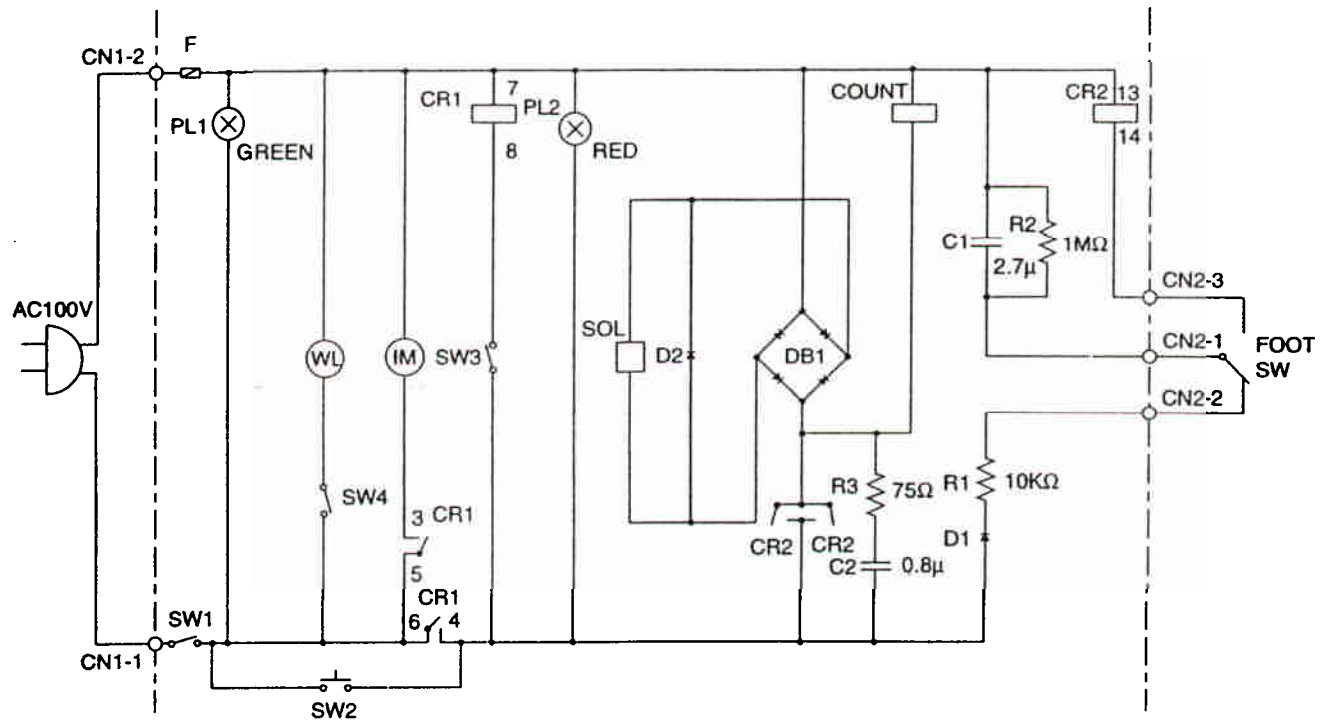

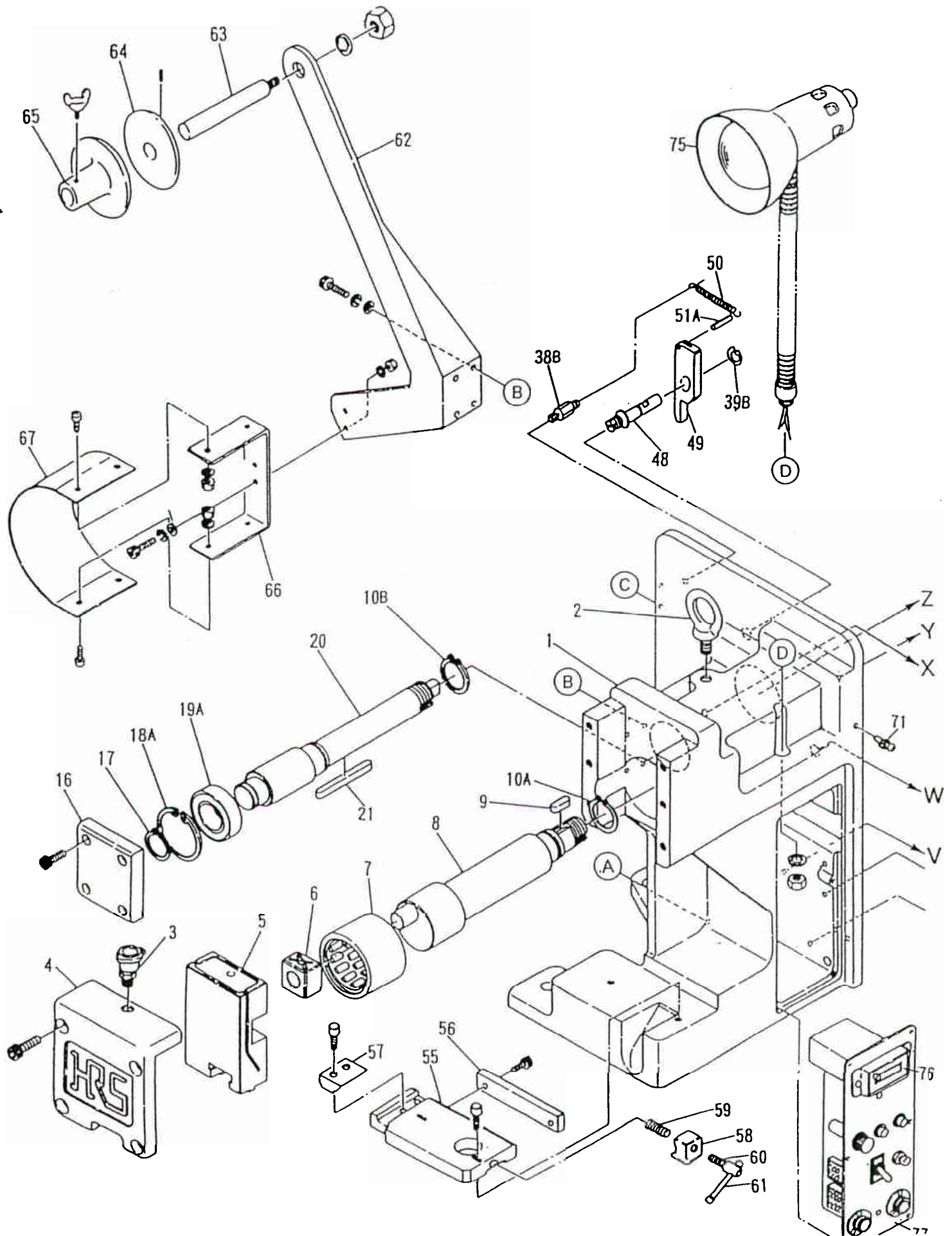

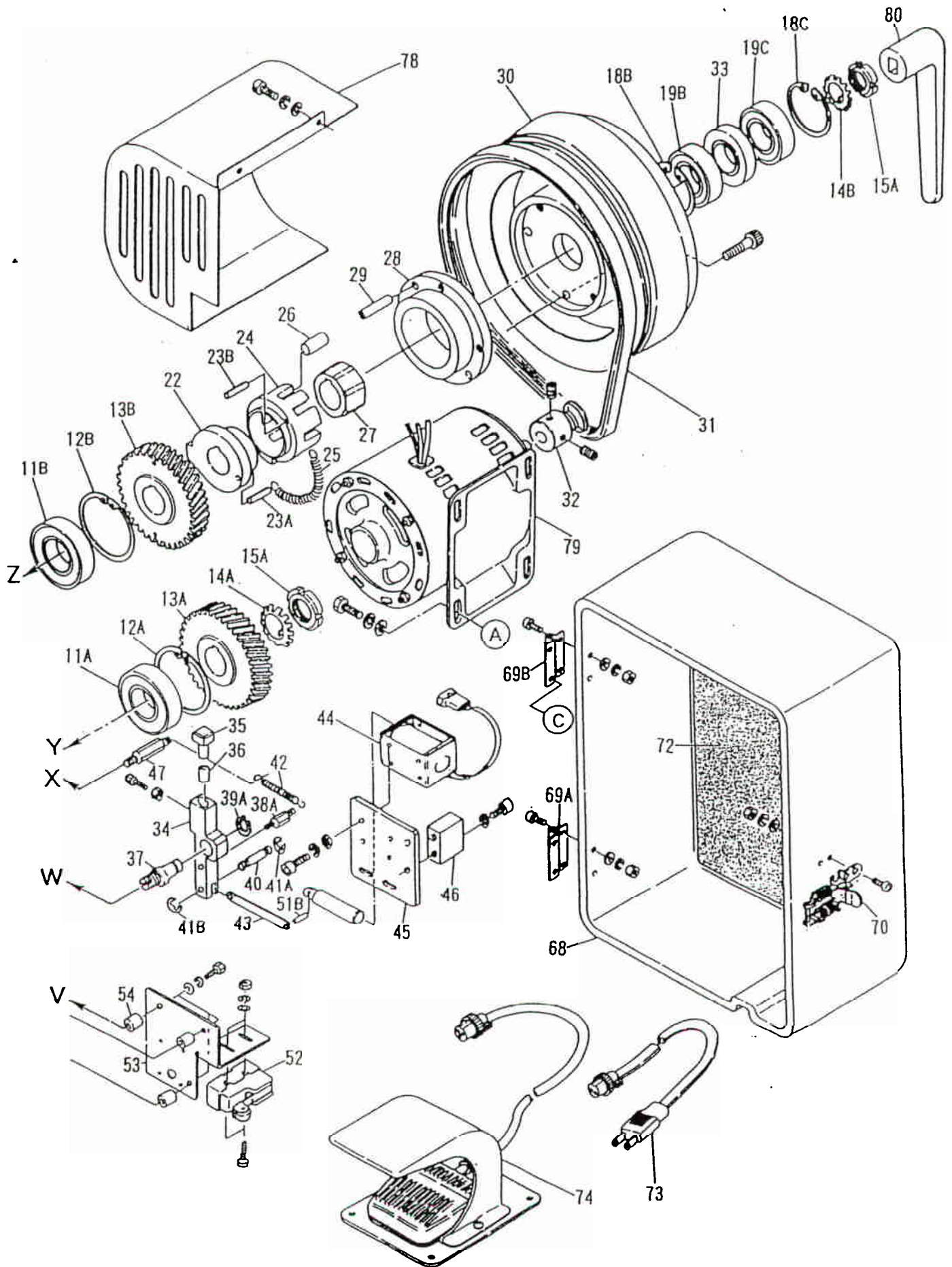
