Dual N-Channel Enhancement Mode Field Effect Transistor


General Description

These N-Channel enhancement mode power field effect transistors are produced using Fairchild's proprietary, high cell density, DMOS technology. This very high density process is especially tailored to minimize on-state resistance and provide superior switching performance. These devices are particularly suited for low voltage applications such as notebook computer power management and other battery powered circuits where fast switching, low in-line power loss, and resistance to transients are needed.




1. R_{gus} is the sum of the junction-to-case and case-to-ambient thermal resistance where the case thermal reference is defined as the solder mounting surface of the drain pins. R_{guc} is guaranteed by design while $R_{\scriptscriptstyle \theta \text{CA}}$ is determined by the user's board design.



Typical R_{qJA} for single device operation using the board layouts shown below on 4.5"x5" FR-4 PCB in a still air environment:

- a. 78°C/W when mounted on a 0.5 in² pad of 2oz copper.
- b. 125°C/W when mounted on a 0.02 in² pad of 2oz copper.
- c. 135°C/W when mounted on a 0.003 in² pad of 2oz copper.




Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics.




Figure 2. On-Resistance Variation with Gate Voltage and Drain Current.




Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation with Temperature.




Figure 4. On-Resistance Variation with Drain Current and Temperature.




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics.




Figure 6. Gate Threshold Variation with Temperature.




Figure 7. Breakdown Voltage Variation with Temperature.




Figure 8. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation with Current and Temperature.




Figure 9. Capacitance Characteristics.




Figure 10. Gate Charge Characteristics.




Figure 11. Transconductance Variation with Drain Current and Temperature.




Figure 12. SO-8 Dual PackageMaximum Steady-State Power Dissipation versus Copper Mounting Pad Area.




Figure 13. Maximum Steady- State Drain Current versus Copper Mounting Pad Area.




Figure 14. Maximum Safe Operating Area.




Figure 15. Transient Thermal Response Curve.
