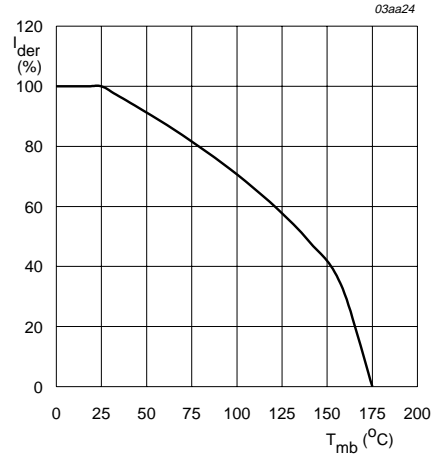

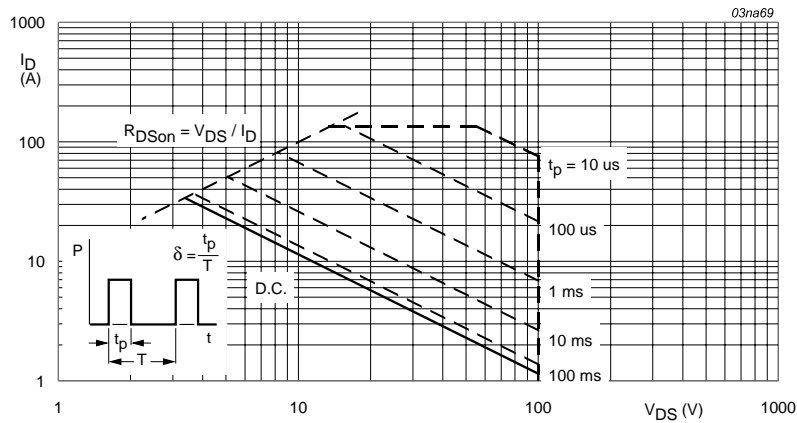
Fig 1. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of mounting base temperature.

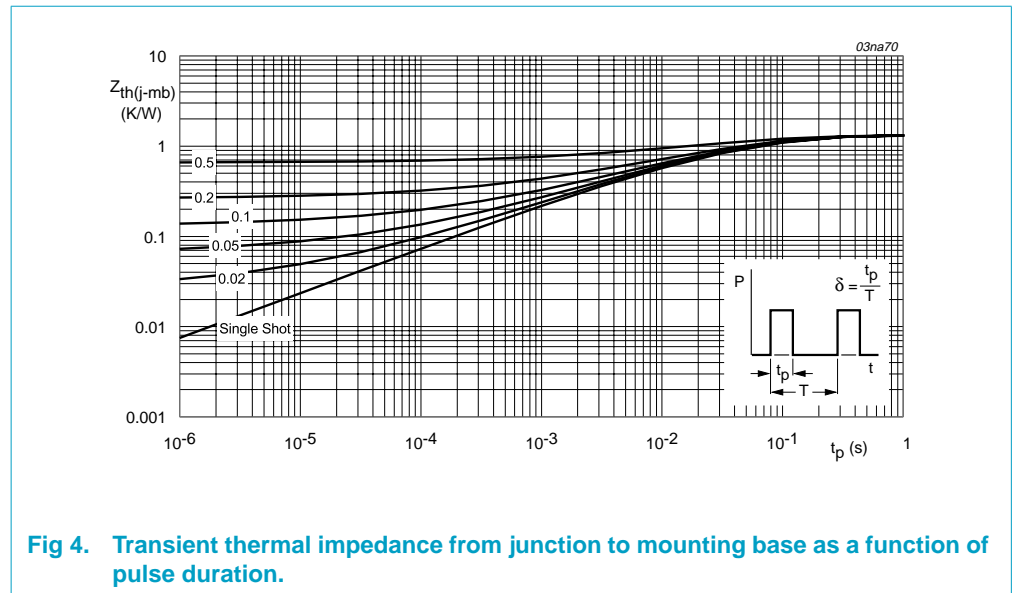


Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration.

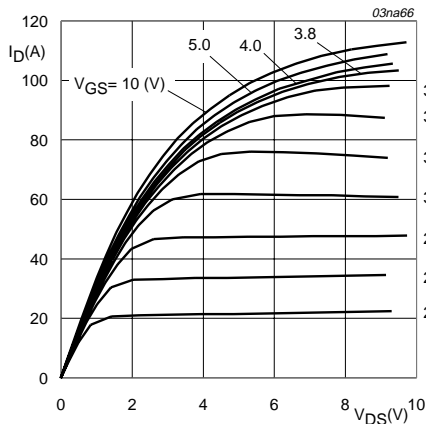

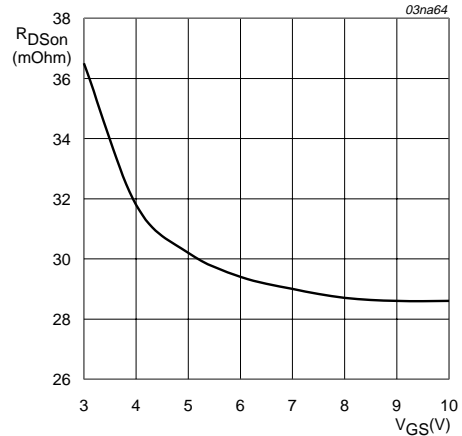

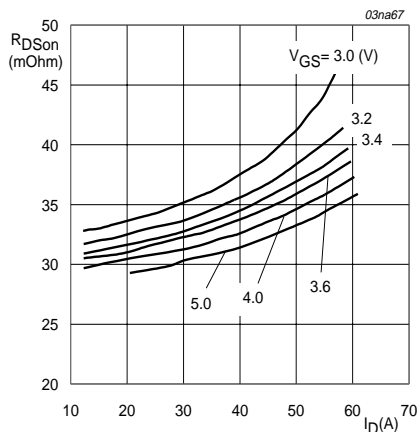

Fig 5. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values.



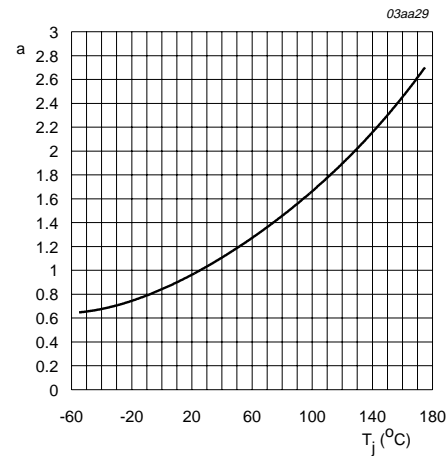

Fig 8. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature.



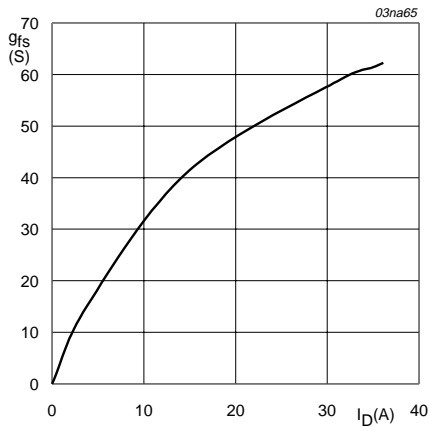

Fig 9. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature.



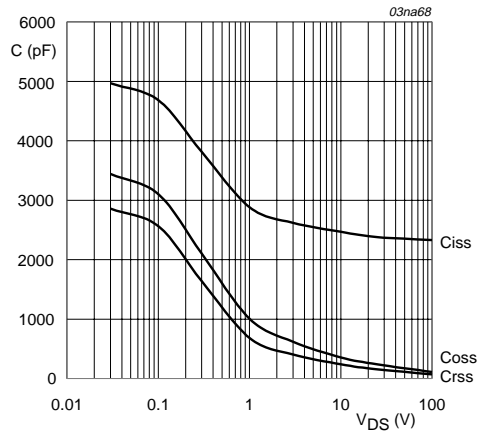

Fig 12. Input, output and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values.

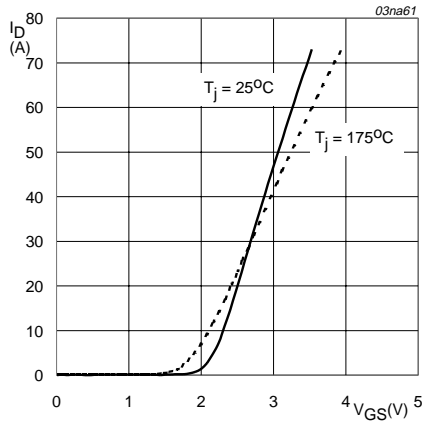


Fig 13. Transfer characteristics; typical values.

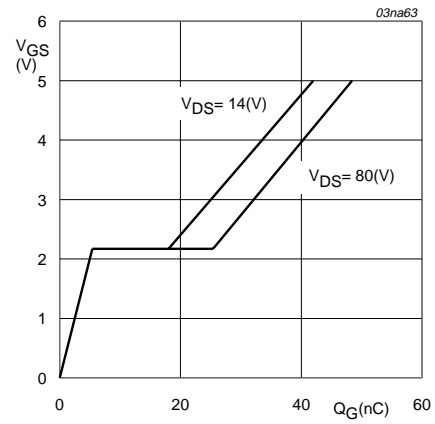


Fig 14. Turn-on gate charge characteristics; typical values.

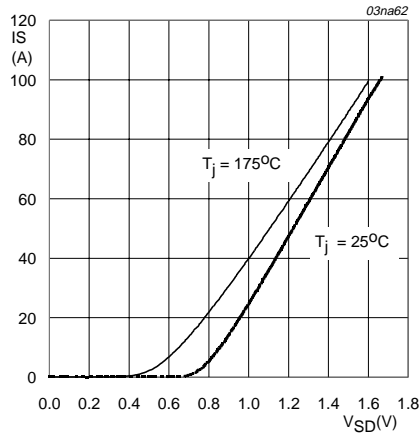


Fig 15. Reverse diode current; typical values.
