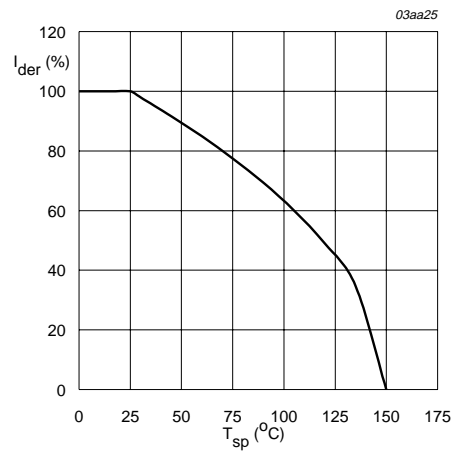

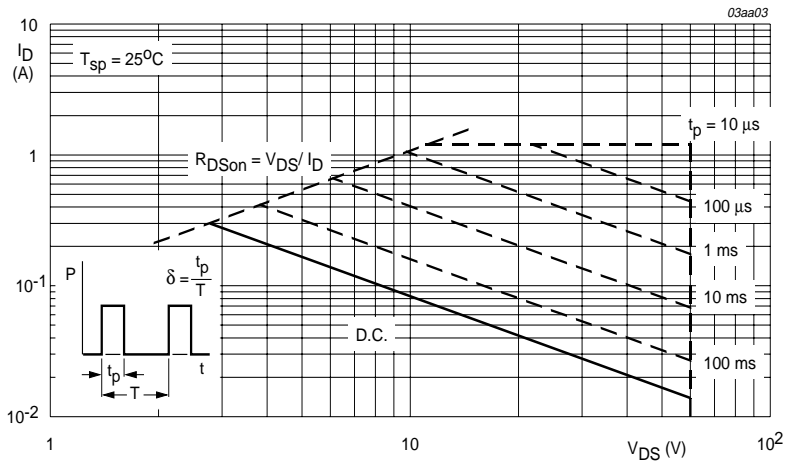
Fig 1. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of solder point temperature.

T<sub>sp</sub> = 25 °C; I<sub>DM</sub> is single pulse.

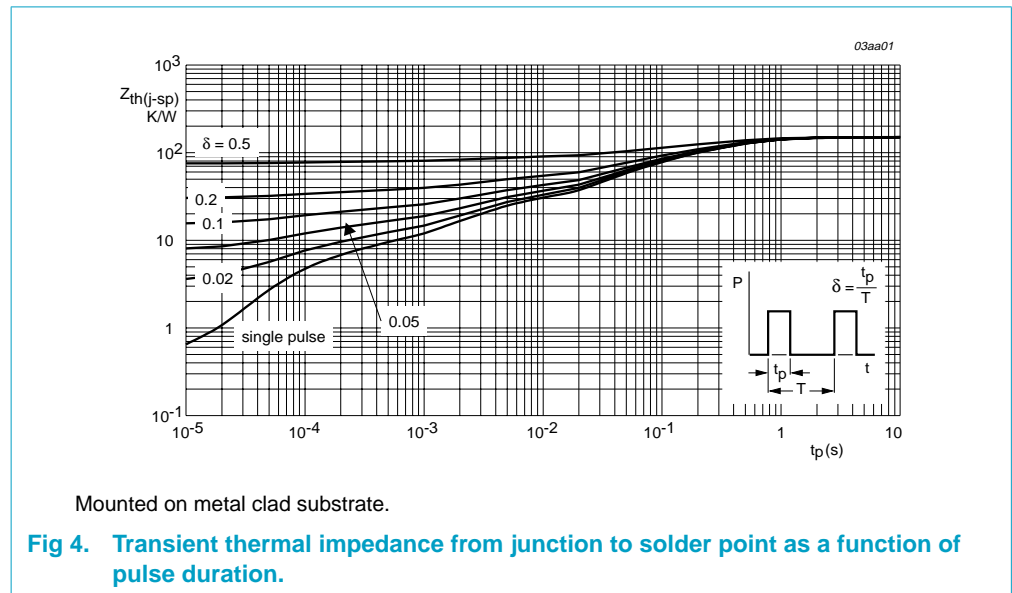
Fig 3. Safe operating area; continuous and peak drain currents as a function of drain-source voltage.

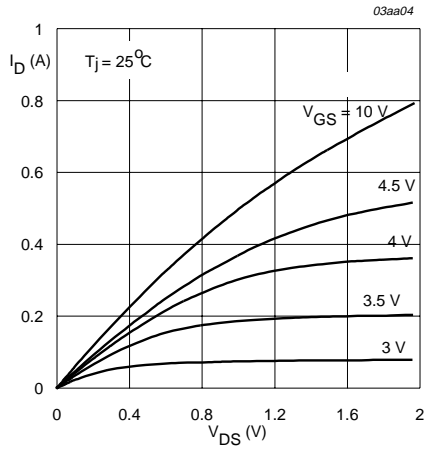
### 7.1 Transient thermal impedance

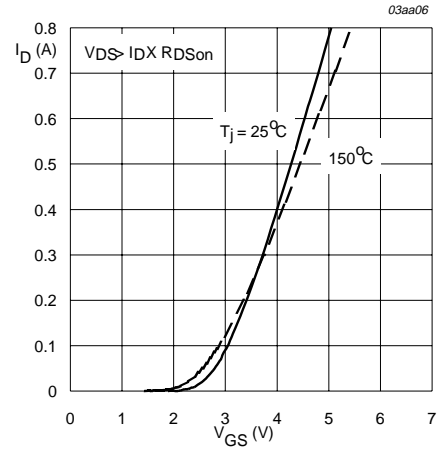

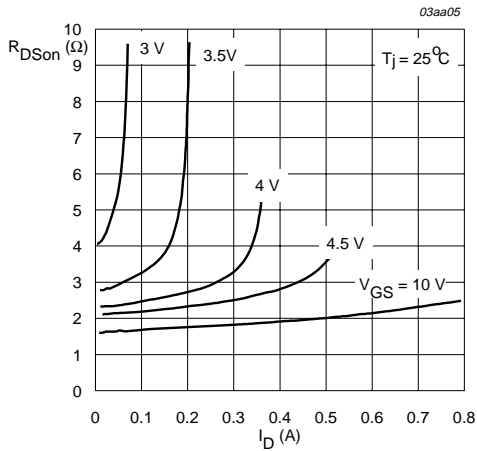

**Fig 5. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values.**



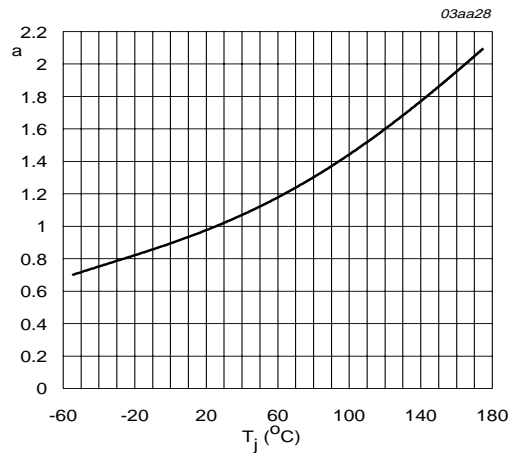

**Fig 6. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values.**



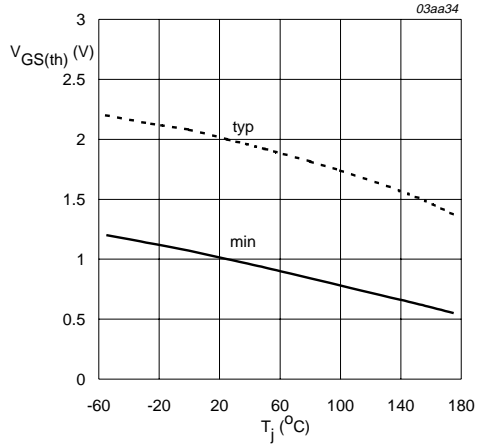

**Fig 7. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values.**



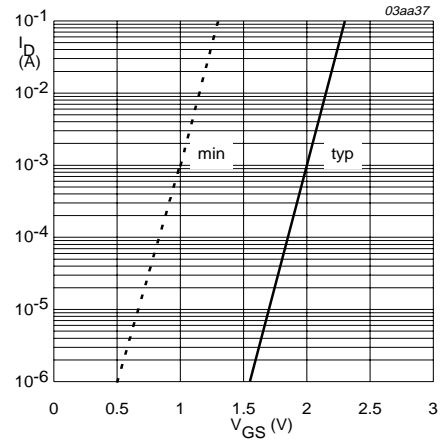

**Fig 8. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature.**



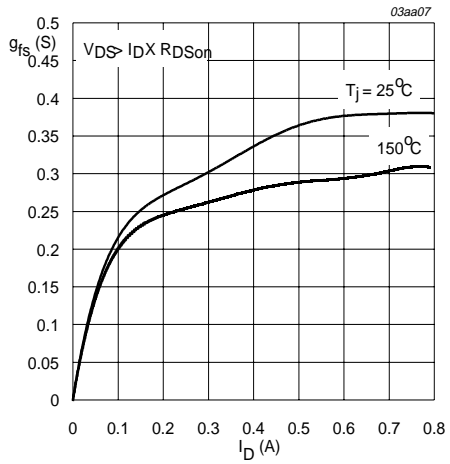

Fig 9. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature.



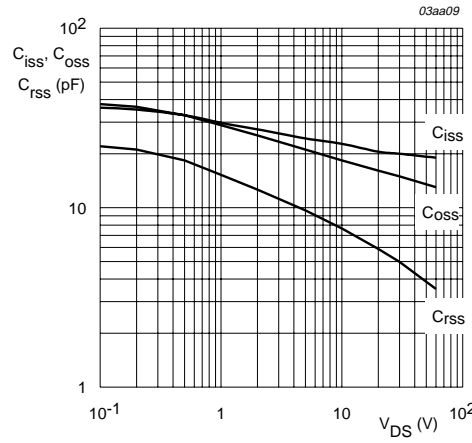

Fig 10. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage.



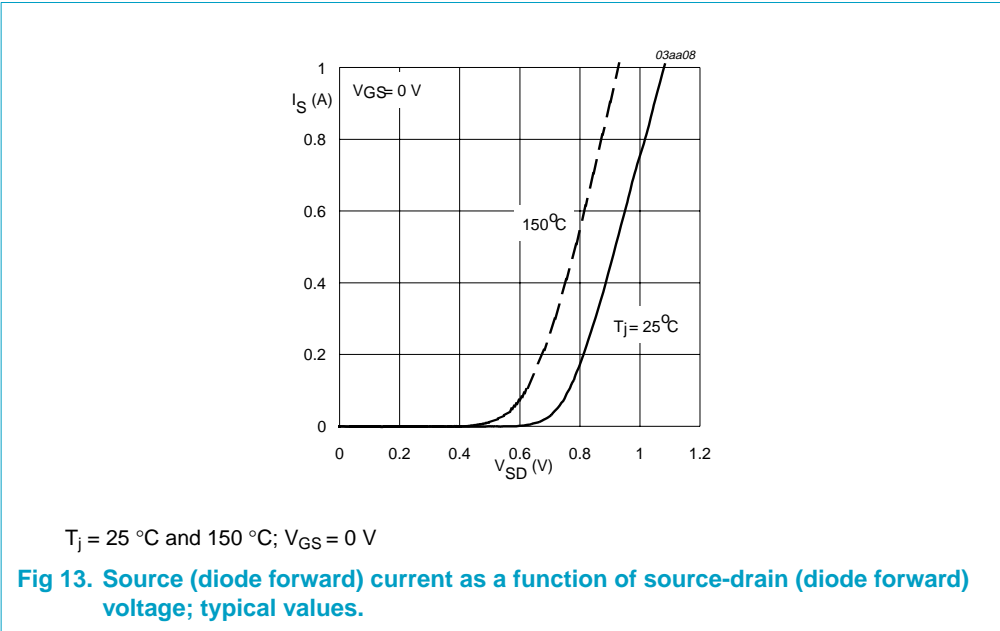

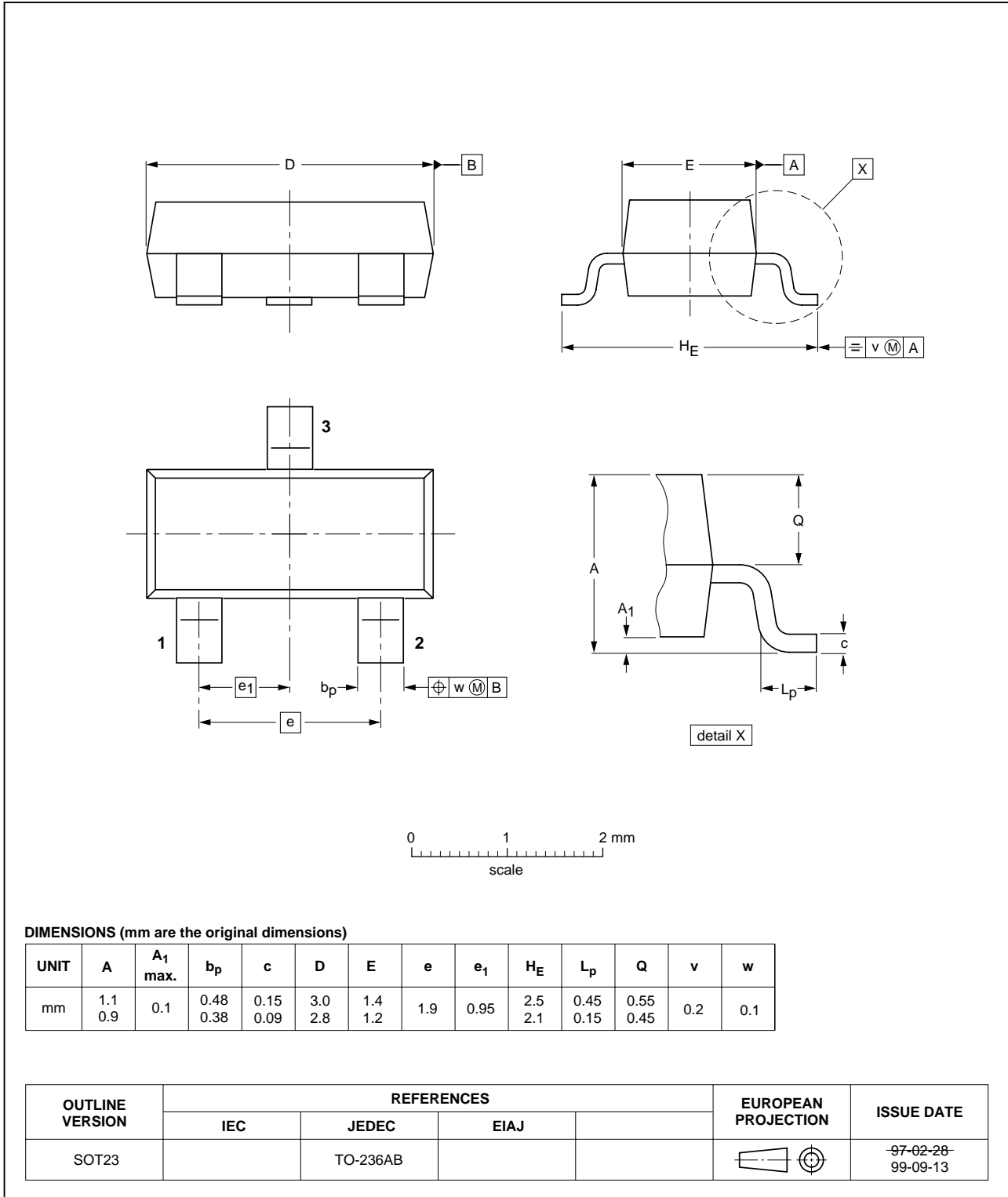


Fig 14. SOT23.
