1. Product profile

1.1 General description

Silicon Monolithic Microwave Integrated Circuit (MMIC) wideband amplifier with internal matching circuit in a 6-pin SOT363 plastic SMD package.

1.2 Features and benefits

- Internally matched to 50 Ω
- A gain of 31.1 dB at 500 MHz
- Output power at 1 dB gain compression = 4 dBm
- Supply current = 16.0 mA at a supply voltage of 2.5 V
- Reverse isolation > 52 dB up to 750 MHz
- Good linearity with low second order and third order products
- Noise figure = 3.2 dB at 500 MHz
- Unconditionally stable ($K > 1$)
- No output inductor required

1.3 Applications

- LNB IF amplifiers
- General purpose low noise wideband amplifier for frequencies between DC and 750 MHz

8. Application information

[Figure 1](#) shows a typical application circuit for the BGA2870 MMIC. The device is internally matched to $50\ \Omega$, and therefore does not need any external matching. The value of the input and output DC blocking capacitors C2 and C3 should not be more than $100\ pF$ for applications above 100 MHz. However, when the device is operated below 100 MHz, the capacitor value should be increased.

The 22 nF supply decoupling capacitor C1 should be located as close as possible to the MMIC.

The PCB top ground plane, connected to pins 2, 4 and 5 must be as close as possible to the MMIC, preferably also below the MMIC. When using via holes, use multiple via holes as close as possible to the MMIC.






Fig 1. Typical application circuit

The MMIC is very suitable as IF amplifier in e.g. LNB's. The excellent wideband characteristics make it an easy building block.


Fig 2. Application as IF amplifier





As second amplifier after an LNA, the MMIC offers an easy matching, low noise solution.










Fig 6. Rollett stability factor as function of frequency; typical values





Fig 7. Input return loss as function of frequency; typical values





Fig 8. Output return loss as function of frequency; typical values







Fig 12. PCB layout and demo board with components


