

Description

The LH1511 relays are SPST normally closed switches (1 Form B) that can replace electromechanical relays in many applications. The relays are con-



structed as a multi-chip hybrid device. Actuation control is via an Infrared LED. The output switch is a combination of a photodiode array with MOSFET switches and control circuity. The relays can be configured for AC/DC or DC only operation.





Fig. 1 Recommended Operating Conditions


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Package Dimensions in Inches (mm)



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Ozone Depleting Substances Policy Statement

It is the policy of Vishay Semiconductor GmbH to

- 1. Meet all present and future national and international statutory requirements.
- 2. Regularly and continuously improve the performance of our products, processes, distribution and operating systems with respect to their impact on the health and safety of our employees and the public, as well as their impact on the environment.

- 3. Council Decision 88/540/EEC and 91/690/EEC Annex A. B and C (transitional substances) respectively.
